## Town Council Tables Disabled Veterans Tax Credit Increase

Londonderry Town Assessor Rick Brideau came before the Town Council at their most recent meeting to discuss Senate Bill 341, telling councilors that it was recently amended. The amendment allows the town to increase the credit from \$2,000 to \$4,000 giving the town the option to allow any amount up to the \$4,000.

He told the council that the bill will go into effect on Jan 1., and the town currently has 35 veterans receiving the current credit. "This would

mean there would be an increase of \$70,000 to the town's bottom line," Brideau said.

Brideau went on to say that he thought it would be in the best interest to the town to postpone the additional tax credit for a couple of years. "We don't know what other towns are going to go to the \$4,000, we could go to any amount between 2,000 and 4,000... but I think we should postpone it."

Town Manager interjected to clarify saying, "This is the Disabled and Combat Veterans Tax Credit which is separate from the All Veterans Tax

Credit which we have adopted and plan to increase \$300 this year and \$500 next year."

Brideau confirmed that the amount being credited was currently at \$2,000.

Councilor Tom Dolan mentioned that he was always was an advocate for the Veterans Tax Credits, those that were for specific veterans for specific times of war. But recently the state has included "All Veterans" in the bills, so he would be in favor of gradually phasing the credits in. As to not shock the taxpayer all

As families all across Londonderry are gathering for the holiday, Lancer Nation is calling out to certain alumni to once again give to something greater than themselves.

"We are calling all angels to come to Londonderry High School on Dec. 21 to celebrate with us the final Pantene Beautiful Lengths large-scale event on Earth," said Steven Juster, LHS English Teacher and Pep Rally Emcee, in a call-to-action for the community.

In 2007, the high school first took part in a new charitable campaign put forth by hair-care company Pantene - a campaign

aptly named "Pantene Beautiful Lengths," where donors, or "Angels" would cut at least eight inches of their own hair to give to someone losing their own to cancer treatment.

In Aug. of this year, however, Pantene announced that it would be ending the Beautiful Lengths campaign on Dec. 31.

According to a press release put out by Pantene, the company is discontinuing the drive due to less demand for real hair wigs and a preference for wigs made with synthetic hair.

# Christmas in the Kings, A Light-O-Rama Show for Fun and Holiday Spirit!

If you like to pack the family up into the car to see different dazzling Christmas displays around New Hampshire, you'll want to check out the "Christmas in the Kings" Light-O-Rama show.

Head over to 3 King Edwards Drive in Londonderry and you will see and hear a fun, cutting edge Christmas show thats a bit like being at a smaller Disney World show event.

The home lighting decoration is not one of those overdone Christmas displays. In fact, you may at first even think the lighting display is subdued - that is, until you tune in your car radio and let the magical, multimedia animations entice you into a Christmas spirit of song and story.

When I first pulled my car up to this Christmas display, I did not understand why the lights were randomly flashing and turning off at times to complete darkness. Once

I got with the right program on the radio, I discovered there was a wonderful show programmed with music syncopated to animation sequences. The musical theatre is built with famous songs from the TransSiberian Orchestra, Michael Buble', the Hawaiian Xmas song - Mele Kalikimaka along with other famous Rock n' Roll and classic Christmas tunes

I was a little taken back to see and hear a fun story from two trees bantering about who was plugged in properly. The key to the magic is to tune your radio in to the FM channel 88.1 when you get to 3 King Edwards Drive. There is a sign out front to explain to turn on your car radio to this channel. The shows start at darkness - about 4:30 p.m. and are turned off at about 11pm.

Brenden and Kelly Sevin produced the light show with certain themes in mind including Harry Potter magic. It is quite the undertaking for Bren-

den to program the software, connect the technology hardware, wire and attach all the lighting strands, and then hook everything together to mix his custom show. Brenden starts the effort in early fall, though he is planning all year round, so he can turn the shows on by Black Friday.

The show is developed from a technology called Light-O-Rama with the idea that show producers can custom control the lights, music, animations and special effects of the system. The lights are programmed via a dedicated computer Brendon uses to orchestrate different events. By the way, not to worry, the Sevin's neighbors are not bothered by the attention and fully support the show.

The Sevin's produce this Christmas celebration to entertain people with Holiday spirit. Brenden says, "The idea is to have fun and bring you back to a mindset of a child experiencing the joy

of Christmas. Kelly says they do it "... because it makes us happy to see the joy in the eyes of the kids that experience the show

The Sevin's support Make a Wish NH and over the past 2 years have raised over \$3200 from those who took in the show and dropped money into the Make a Wish bucket near their driveway/street curb.

Kings" is located on King Edward Drive in the area of streets named, King Richard, King Charles, King Phillip, King John, King Henry and more. ### Manouchehr Akhbari



Manouchehr (Manou) Akhbari died on Nov. 11, 2018 at Catholic Medical Center in Manchester at the age of 92. He was in New Hampshire visiting family in Londonderry to attend his beloved granddaughter's wedding celebration.

Manou was born in Iran and immigrated to the United States in 1987 residing in Dayton OH. He lived for his family and got to see nieces, nephews, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren while in Londonderry including Sophia a great-granddaughter for the first time who was visiting from Maui. Tragically he never made it to the wedding celebration an event he desperately wanted to attend.

Manou retired from the Iranian Air Force and gave up his pension when he immigrated to the United States at age 61 to live near his children. He worked for 10 years as a handyman to earn Social Security benefits. Manou was an avid gardener and loved spending time with friends and family. Manou never stop learning new things. For his 90th birthday he got an I-pad and quickly mastered it along with Facebook, Telegram, Skype, and many other apps. An I-phone 7 quickly followed the I-pad and was equally mastered. Manou loved to play Backgammon and would routinely beat his opponents either in person or virtually on the I-pad.

Manou is survived by his wife of 71 years, Forough; a sister Malieh of Iran; children Hamid Akhbari (Marlena) and Helen Martin (Jim); grandchildren Michael Akhbari (Gayden), Elyse Akhbari (Stephen Murphy), Nicholas Martin (Millie), David Martin (Amy), and Jusmine Martin (Blair Rutherford); and great grandchildren, Allana Martin, Margaret Akhbari, Sophia Martin, Anne Akhbari, and Lydia Murphy - along with friends and loved ones the world over. He also leaves behind several nieces and nephews still in Iran. He was predeceased by a daughter Simin, and a sister Fakhrie.

at once.

"I support this, but I think it is reasonable that we phase it in," Dolan said.

Dolan continued to say that a \$70,000 will be a two cent hit on the tax rate, "I would recommend that we phase it in over a three year period."

Council Vice Chair Joe Green disagreed. He thought the town doesn't do enough for our veter-

ans and thought that the money could come out of the Undesignated Fund Balance or some other way. Green said, "I'd like to go with the full \$4,000 right away."

During the meeting, a very young boy was in attendance holding a sign saying, "Support Our Veterans."

Council Chair John Farrell acknowledged the sign and said, "You can't go to the Veteran's Breakfast every year and recognize the value they give to

our country, and seeing that the building next door is going to spend \$250,000 because they said they're air was no good, I can go half way, right now."

"We can go to \$3,000, and if I get re-elected we can go to \$4,000," Farrell added.

Where only three of the five councilors were present for the meeting, Green asked invoke Councilor Privilege, and table the decision until the next meeting.



# Londonderry Honors Skip Burbine, Tennis Coach and Champion

**B**eloved Tennis Coach, Henry "Skip" Burbine has been recognized by the Town of Londonderry with a renaming of the Town Recreation Tennis Courts to be known going forward as the Skip Burbine Tennis Courts. The Town Council approved a resolution to commemorate Skip on Nov. 19.

Council Chairman John Farrell's resolution pointed out that Skip had dedicated his a life to tennis and that he brought his passion for tennis and sports to the Londonderry community while influencing many Londonderry youth and adults to do their best.

Burbine's name is widely recognized in the tennis world around New Hampshire and New England. It is fitting for Londonderry, where Skip lived over the past 22 years, to now have Tennis courts dedicated to Skip's name. He made a mark in Tennis and in 2011, the Burbine family including Skip's children, Cassie and Alex were recognized by the New England Sports Community as

The Skip Burbine Tennis Courts are located near the Londonderry Town Center - off Robert Lincoln Way, within he Nelson Road Fields / Londonderry Athletic Field Association (LAFA) area. The LAFA Town Recre-

ation area consists of approximately 57 acres of fields and includes 4 public lighted tennis courts within 2 tennis complexes.

Skip, who passed away this past October was widely recognized for both his tennis playing skills and his coaching

expertise. It is appropriate Skip's love for tennis will be carried forward with his name connected to the tennis courts in Londonderry, where he dedicated much time teaching and coaching many Londonderry youth and adults about how to play tennis with great skill. Skip helped some of his students including has family to achieve a championship status in Tennis.

Skip coached both the boy's and girl's Londonderry High School (LHS) tennis teams including 2010 LHS Boy's Tennis Team to their 1st state

championship in school history. Skip also coached the 2014 girl's singles championship team. Skip was an active board member, and former President, of the Granite State Kids Tennis organization - a grassroots tennis program focused on spreading the love of tennis to junior players across New Hampshire.

Skip was passionate about sports his whole life. In his youth, he was part of the Hampton Beach surfing community, winning the prestigious NH State Amateur Surf Tournament at "The Wall" in Hampton Beach at 19

years old. A short time later, tennis became Skip's true athletic passion. He competed across New England tennis tournaments with countless championship appearances and wins. Skip's reputation as a topnotch professional tennis coach developed as he enjoyed sharing his passion for tennis with thousands of players and students throughout his life. The Tennis Courts in Londonderry now have a legacy name to remember a man whose passion was to bring out the best in people with the sport he loved.

Girl Scouts Make The World a Better Place states a logo used by our local Girl Scout Troops. And the Girl Scouts (GS) of Londonderry are making winter holidays bright for other kids again. This year marks the third year of their Operation Snowflake drive mission. The drive benefits kids by providing them with warm coats, pants, scarfs, sweaters, hats, gloves and other warm winter wear. Operation Snowflake is about providing for kids who may not have proper snow attire, so they can play in the snow during school recess and enjoy winter outdoors during the cold season.

Local Girl Scouts troops are not only involved in Operation Snowflake this time of year, they are also quite busy with additional holiday spirit activities. Girls Scouts will be caroling on the Common at the Londonderry Christmas lighting event on December 2, as well as caroling at All American Assisted Living, decorating eight of the Londonderry Com-

mons Christmas trees and supporting blanket drives. There are 5 GS troops (50 kids) participating in Operation Snowflake and 9 troops are decorating trees on the Common.

Operation Snowflake originated with the idea that kids could be encouraged to play outside all year round even when it's cold and there is snow. Schools don't want cold, wet kids coming back inside from recess shivering though, so proper snow gear is important in the winter. However, some kids just don't have good winter snow pants or coats or gloves due to circumstances beyond their control, so this drive is setup to meet that challenge. Any remainder winter clothing collected and not used by the schools is given to Derry Renew Clothing Ministry for distribution to other kids who will benefit from the warm apparel.

Operation Snowflake has received great support from Londonderry School Principals, Superintendents and the Town Hall. The Scouts decorate a box, drop it off at

the schools and pick up the collected winter clothing for the proper distribution.

Liz O'Neal, Londonderry Girl Scout (GS) Recruiter and Leader, discovered there was a GS badge called Operation Snowflake where girls do seasonal events together. Liz and her daughter Sabrina came up with an idea to give back to others 3 years ago. Their idea was to set up the schools for the used clothing collection - and then school nurses or other school staff could discretely go through and pick the right sizing to hand off to kids they know might benefit. Any clothes not chosen at the school is then further redistributed with care. As Liz and Sabrina say "You're in NH - Get outside and play - Snow is fun, when you stay warm!"

The girls in Londonderry's multiple GS Troop are passionate about Operation Snowflake. Arianna Conomacos, 6th grader

says, "It means a lot to me to help others less fortunate than me and it feels good to help out our community." Sabrina O'Neil, 6th grader reports, "Operation Snowflake makes me think of how happy other kids will be when they get snow clothes and can play outside." Aryana Chilles, 6th grader tells, "It makes me feel good to be able to help kids in town, especially in the cold season."

These three girls, Arianna, Sabrina, and Aryana, also recently won bronze awards, the highest national award recognition a Junior Girl Scout (4th - 5th grade) can earn. These awards are about girls giving their best to our community and creating good will for others. Just this month the girls were approved for the recognition by their council, Girl Scouts of the Green and White Mountains, located in Bedford.

In addition to regular meetings, all the local Girl Scout troops are busy all

year round in our community with parades, an Engineering Night, Skits and SWAPS (a bring-a-friend Girl Scout party), yearly Odiorne State Park beach clean-up and more. As you can see by their actions, Londonderry Girl

Scouts are more than just cookies. The Londonderry Girl Scout troops in our area are very active and on a mission to help spread good will to our community - they truly make the world a better place.

### Thomas Tremonte



Thomas Tremonte, Jr., 71, of Londonderry, died peacefully Thursday, Nov. 22, at the NH Veteran's Home, Tilton, NH. He had been a resident there for 8 years, and was cared for by an outstanding, devoted, loving staff. He was born on Feb. 2, 1947, a son of Thomas Sr. and Felecia (Borriello) Tremonte, and grew up in Westport, CT. He was a beloved son, brother, husband, father, and grandfather. He is survived by his wife of 47 years, Peggy (Kish) Tremonte; two sons, Thomas P. (wife, Jessica) of Londonderry, and Michael J. of San Diego, CA; a daughter, Julie A. Tremonte of Tacoma, WA; his mother and a sister, Loretta Tremonte of Westport, CT; and two granddaughters.

Following graduation from Staples High School in Westport, Tom attended Southern Connecticut University for a brief period before entering the US Air Force in 1967. He served in Vietnam from 1968-69 and was decorated with several commendations and medals. His life-long career as a plumbing & heating contractor began with training he received while serving his country. Upon his active military discharge in 1971, Tom completed formal training and apprenticeship as a Master Plumber. He ran his own successful plumbing and heating company for over 25 years.

Tom was an avid sportsman. He passionately pursued all types of hunting and fishing activities; his favorites being bird hunting with the dogs he trained from puppies, and deer hunting trips to PA with his hunting buddies. For several years, he and Peggy raised, trained, and showed quarter horses in Ohio. Tom was also an instrument rated private pilot. He flew his own Cessna 182, which he was very proud of, for many years. In the 1980's he was one of the founders of MAOPA, the private pilot's association at Manchester Airport. He had been a staunch voice for the rights of private pilots as the airport's commercial expansion developed.

Tom enjoyed playing football throughout high school, in the Air Force, and during his time in college, but his greatest success was his long tenure coaching Flag and Pop Warner youth football in Londonderry during the 15 years his two sons were playing. He continued strong support of Lancer Football as they advanced their play through high school. Throughout those years many boys (and a few girls!) benefited from his ability to instill dedication toward teamwork and work ethics.

Tom/"Tommy" will be remembered for his devotion and commitment to his family and many friends. He was always striving for the best possible results whether in work or play. Everyone knew when Tom was involved, his enthusiasm and intensity would create a successful outcome.

# Recent State Legislation Raises New Questions For Town Budgeting

There is opinion from Town attorneys and across the Londonderry Town Council members that new budget laws, namely NH House Bill 1307 and NH Senate Bill 342, require a different approach for budget planning by the Town. The recent state legislation outlines how the town budget process should now be calculated and presented to voters next Spring. The Londonderry Town Council, Finance Director and legal advisors agree that this legislation presents new questions for the Londonderry Town Council to act upon.

The difficulty of the new budget process for many New Hampshire towns starts with how default budgets are calculated - in context of a proposed operating budget and supplemental appro-

priations. Default budget calculations by law are now based directly upon last years operating budget and not reworked from the bottom up. The new legislation is intended to guide how New Hampshire towns develop their proposed operating budgets, so the budgets can be transparently understood by a Town's voters and properly administered by the Town across all of its organizational resources.

The legislation specifically affects the dynamics of constructing a default budget in context of a proposed operating budget that will incorporate supplementary appropriations. A key issue is how to outline supplemental appropriations impacted over time including reoccurring expenditures from the past. Based on this legislation, Town Councils across New Hampshire may have

challenges for reconciling the coming years budget for voters to approve or disapprove.

In Londonderry, Kevin Smith - Town Manager and Doug Smith - Finance Director helped kick off the Londonderry Town budget workshop discussions with the Town Council members. Along with John Farrell - Town Council Chairman, they outlined the initial thinking about the best way to put together the default budget aligned to proposed operating budget to also properly account for supplementary appropriations.

Last week, the Londonderry school board began their initial budget workshop - for a budget that is to be aligned to the Town's Budget process. The School Board was presented a legal overview of the new budget legislation from Attorney Gordon Graham. Town Council Chairman John Farrell pointed out that there has been discussions involving the Town Attorney and the School Board's Attorney Graham on how to best proceed developing the coming years budget to meet legal guidelines.

Chairman Farrell pointed out that Attorney Graham had presented the School Board Council with a possibility for an amendment to the specific Londonderry School Board Charter - so the school board could construct their budget with alignment to the new legislation though closer to previous budget processes. There is legal opinion

and consideration that a Charter change by the School Board may be a remedy to move past the complexity of the new legislation.

The Town Council further discussed how budget calculations within the new New Hampshire budget laws could present issues with the supplementary appropriation calculation in a proposed

operating budget that could fall back to a default budget in the voting process. There could be challenges to keep the town running efficiently and paying bills as certain budget items vary over time due to changing contracts, staff increases/reductions or with other items that come up during the budget year or in legacy agreements.

# Planning Board Will Hold Hearing on Zoning Amendments

The Londonderry Planning Board will be holding a Public Meeting on Wednesday, Dec. 12, at 7 p.m. in the Moose Hill Council Chambers, to consider the following:

A Public Hearing on a zoning amendment to create special exception criteria in the Londonderry Zoning Ordinance.

The hearing will outline certain zoning districts through the process of obtaining a special exception from the Zoning Board of Adjustment.

The Zoning Board of Adjustment may grant

such special exceptions in appropriate cases and subject to appropriate conditions so as to be in harmony with the general purpose and intent of the Zoning Ordinance where the applicant(s) can demonstrate to the satisfaction of the Zoning Board of Adjustment the following:

A. Such use will not be detrimental to the health or safety of residents;

B. Such use will not create undue traffic congestion or a traffic safety hazard in the vicinity of the proposed development;

C. Such use will not be incompatible with surrounding neighborhood;

E. Such use will not be a detriment to property values in the vicinity of the proposed development with consideration given to the location or scale of buildings, structures, parking areas, or other access ways;

F. No nuisance will be created by such use by way of emission of odors, smoke, gas, dust, noise, glare, heat, vibration, or other pollutants; or the unsightly outdoor storage of equipment, vehicles, or other materials;

G. Such use will not create a hazard to the public or adjacent property on account of potential fire, explosion, or release of toxic materials;

H. Such use will not result in the degradation of existing surface and groundwater quality standards, nor will it have adverse effects on the natural functions of wetlands on the site which would result in the loss of significant habitat or flood control protection;

I. Adequate and appropriate facilities will be provided for the intended use; and

J. All necessary state and federal permits will be obtained.

The Board of Adjustment may attach such conditions as it deems necessary to the granting of the special exception if the Board determines that such conditions are necessary to maintain the essential character of the neighborhood and/or to protect the health, safety and welfare of the Town and its residents. Such conditions may include but are not limited to the site plan review and approval from the Planning Board which includes

review and comment from the Conservation Commission and Heritage Commission.

A special exception must be acted upon within two years or such special exception will be deemed to have expired and/or be lost by abandonment.

donderry Zoning Ordinance that are largely organizational and non-substantive. The following sections (inclusive of subsections) are proposed to be amended:

General reorganization of the full ordinance

According to Londonderry Town Planner Colleen Mailloux, the 2014-2015 audit of the Zoning Ordinance and Site Plan and Subdivision Regulations identified

several areas where amendments were recommended in order to improve the clarity, consistency, user-friendliness and administrative effectiveness of the town's land use regulations, and to facilitate implementation of portions of the most recent master plan. Some changes already implemented included the 2015 Workforce Housing Zoning Update, and the 2016 Parking and Loading amendments.

The amendment currently before the Council

is a comprehensive organizational update, which addresses inconsistencies, improves clarity and organization, and overall user-friendliness of the Zoning Ordinance. On Oct. 10, 2018 the Planning Board held a Public Hearing on proposed amendments to the Londonderry Zoning Ordinance and unanimously recommended adoption of the amendments by the Town Council.

Nov. 19, 2018 was the first reading of this ordinance to introduce it before the Town Council.

A second reading and public hearing will take place on Dec. 13, 2018.

The proposed changes are largely organizational in nature as summarized below.

- General reorganization of the ordinance to create a new section, "Supplementary Regulations and Standards", and relocate a number of articles (i.e. Residential Phasing, Planned Unit Development, Accessory Dwelling, Home Occupations, Inclusionary Housing, Portable Storage Structures, etc.) to that section in order to improve the format, navigation and ease of use of the ordinance.

- Section 1.2 - Impact Fees was removed in its entirety

- Section 1.4 - Growth Management was removed in its entirety as that section has sunset.

- Section 1.5 - Special Development and Review Procedures was eliminat-

ed and

replaced with a new section, "Conditional Use Permits", which contains the procedures, general criteria and specific criteria for all Conditional Use Permit applications.

- Airport Approach Height Overlay District and Airport Approach Noise

Overlay District reflect the updated airport name and were revised for consistency with the review and approval process, eliminating obsolete references to administration of the ordinance through the State Bureau of Aeronautics.

- Floodplain Overlay District contains minor, non-substantive updates for consistency with current terminology.

- Home Occupation criteria were revised to allow home occupations which are

not evident to the general public to be uses permitted by right, while

retaining the Special Exception process for other home occupations.

- Definitions were substantially consolidated into one section where appropriate, and duplicative or contradictory definitions corrected for consistency.

In her email to the council, Mailloux stated that, "Though many of these changes are not significant in terms of impact in the application of zoning requirements in the Town, it is of critical importance for the Town's ordinance to be reviewed and updated in order to ensure that it is legal and defensible."

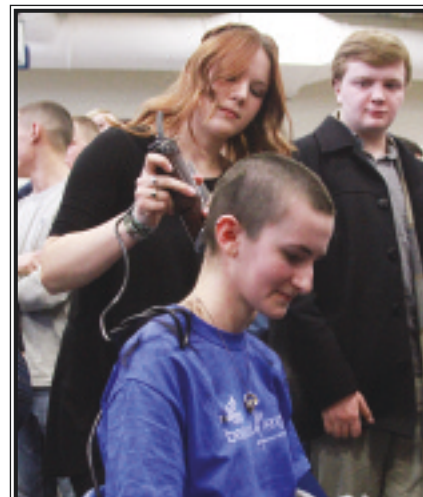

## Nearly 700 Brave Cold and Run in the Annual Turkey Trot

There were over 650 runners participating in the 45th annual Greater Derry Track Club Turkey Trot race Thanksgiving morning.

The freezing temperatures were not enough to scare off the dedicated runners, who came to begin their holiday celebrations in style and completed the 5K scenic course, which took them around the residential roads of Beaver Lake in Derry.

Out of the 325 male runners, the winner was 21-year-old Aushir Smith from Topfield, Mass. He crossed the finish line after 16:35 minutes, only four seconds ahead of runner up Joe Gagnon, an 18-year-old Pinkerton Academy runner from Hooksett, who was the first among his division's (15-19 year olds) 38 participants. In third place came 20-year-old Seth Richardson from Wolfeboro Falls. He crossed the line at 16:41 minutes. Of note, the 54-year-old runner Mark Hecox, from Salem, New Hampshire, finished ninth overall with an impressive time of 18:30 minutes.

There were 339 women running the race, and the winner was 27-year-old Morgan Lingor, who came all the way from New York and ran a 19:20 minute 5K. The second woman to cross the finish line was the 40-year-old Pinkerton Academy running coach, and previous title-holder, Amy Bernard from Hampstead. She came in just 43 seconds after Lingor.

As for local runners, the best Londonderry resident of the day was 14-year-old Matthew Palmer, who came in 38th after running a 22:18 5K. Right behind him, at the 48th overall place, was Londonderry's fastest female runner, 18-year-old Kalin Gregoire. She had a time of 23:04 minutes. Zack Luongo managed a top-50 spot (49th) with a time of 23:05.

The fastest Derry resident that morning was 17-year-old Jeff Mize, who finished seventh overall with a time of 17:47. Those who followed were Rusty Risteen (19-year-old, 12 overall, 19:09 minutes) and Craig Coventry (13-year-old, 19 overall, 20:14 minutes). The best Derry female

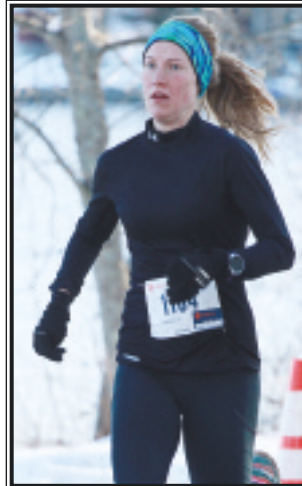

runner was Emilee Risteen (23-years-old, 43 overall, 22:48 minutes) with Ginia Rufo (12-year-old, 65 overall, 23:45 minutes) coming second.

The youngest runners were Simon Manners from Pelham and Leah Unger from Raymond, only eight years old. The oldest runner was Londonderry's John Loker, a 75-year-old who needed only 29 minutes to complete the course and finished in the 201 place overall. Charles Morganson from Derry, a 72-year-old, finished 489 overall with a time of 38:27.

Race director Sean Coyle said: "We had a

ture Londonderry High School alumni, Neil Baroody, who was recently appointed as an assistant coach.

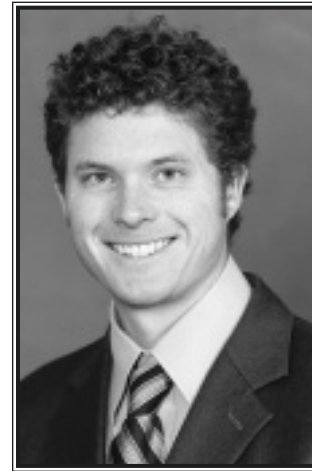
