After having to be canceled last year due to COVID-19 pandemic, the annual Beautify Londonderry

Town Roadside Cleanup will be taking place again this year.

Beautify Londonderry Chair Jocelyn Muller explained that the roadside cleanup is organ-

ized by a planning committee and has been taking place for many years.

Last year however they weren't able to

## Londonderry Schools Back to Full In-School Learning

On April 2, Governor Chris Sununu rescinded his previous Executive Order which allowed school districts to use remote learning as a mode of learning.

This means that all schools K-12 were required to have full, In-Person learning five days a week starting on Monday, April 19.

Londonderry Superintendent Scott Laliberte made it known that this wouldn't impact all of the schools in the District.

"Five out of the six schools in Londonderry are not impacted by this

Executive Order. They offer in person instruction five days per week. That's one of the first things I wanted to be clear about," he said.

Laliberte explained that the one school in the school district being impacted is Londonderry High School.

He said that currently they go to school in a hybrid model currently meaning students go to school every other day in person and then every other day they do their school remotely.

However, because of the change to the Executive Order, this is not in compliance.

"That is not in compliance with the Execu-

tive Order. As a result of that we are going to have to adjust our model of operation beginning on April 19. We will be having all students return here in Londonderry High School each day," Laliberte said.

Laliberte said that one of the things that he's received the most calls about is in regards to whether or not students are allowed to continue to do distance learning for the rest of the year if their parents pick that option.

He said that will continue to be an option.

"It's a choice that we offered and it's a choice

## DES Briefs PFAS Task Force on Various Water Options

Officials from the state's Department of Environmental Services spoke to members of the Londonderry PFAS Task Force on April 7 on the impact of PFAS in town and treatment options available for residents.

This meeting was originally scheduled to be a live meeting, but was changed to a video-conference meeting shortly before it began on Wednesday.

PFAS in southern NH have been found in soil,

groundwater, and food because of their broad use in commerce and ability to resist water and grease. The two most studied PFAS are Perfluorooctanoic Acid (PFOA) and Perfluorooctane Sulfonate (PFOS), the latter of which is a compound associated with firefighting foams.

PFAS are a class of synthetic organic compounds containing multiple fluorine atoms, explained Michael Wimsatt, director of the DES waste management division.

In February 2016,

PFOA contamination was found at Saint-Gobain's Merrimack plastics facility on the Merrimack River during water tests. PFOA was detected at 30 parts per trillion (PPT) in the public Merrimack Village District supplied water system.

# Planning Board Inadvertently Violates Right to Know Law

The Londonderry Planning Board unintentionally violated the Right to Know law by conducting what amounted to a meeting without public notice.

Planning Board Chairman Arthur Rugg reported what occurred to board members at their April 7 meeting.

Kay Webber of the Londonderry Historical Society had emailed Rugg about design of metal roofs with the purpose of getting the information to the full board. He then forwarded it as a conduit to both the board and the Heritage Commission.

Only a single comment on the topic came back, from planning member Giovanni Verani. However, he emailed

his comments to all the board.

"So that constitutes a meeting by RSA 91-A," said Rugg. "As a result it's basically an illegal meeting."

A member who is emailing someone must send the communication only to that individual, not to the entire board in a group email.

Because it has gone out, the entire stream of email communication will be made public and will be appended to the minutes of the board's April 7 meeting.

Rugg suggested that Verani can voice his views about metal roof design in a public meeting with Webber also invited to participate.

Verani apologized to his colleagues for his misstep though said he thought he was only giving his views on a metal

roof color in his email.

Member Lynn Wiles mentioned his email account has not worked since he rejoined the board and therefore Verani didn't communicate with the entire board though it was a majority.

In turning to business at the meeting, because it was found incomplete, the board delayed review until May 12 of a site plan for an elderly housing development partially located in Derry with 44 townhouses and associated site improvements at 8 Gilcreast Road, Map 7 Lot 105, zoned AR-1, 81.5 Kendall Pond Road, Derry Tax Map 0217-6, and 83.5 Kendall Pond Road, Derry Tax Map 0217-7. NH Sustainable Communities, LLC is the applicant and Property Possible, Inc., the

owner.

In other business, the board conditionally approved a request from Lorden Commons, LLC to make a lot line adjustment of 7.5 feet between Tax Map 16 Lot 38-126 and Map 16 Lot 38-127, 44 and 46 Clover Lane, zoned AR-1.

In looking at minimum lot widths for a 133 lot subdivision, the design process here missed a front setback off Calla Road and a side setback, said Jason Lopez, project manager at Keach-Nordstrom Associates. This resulted in a 25-foot wide building envelop.

The lot adjustment will expand the building area on Lot 127 from 25 to 32.5 feet and reduce the building envelop on Lot 126 from 40 to 32.5 feet.

In addition, the board

conditionally approved a plan to subdivide one residential lot into 8 single family lots, Tax Map 12 Lot 29, 40 Kelley Road and Hazelnut Lane, zoned AR-1. The owner and applicant is Jean Gagnon.

It further conditionally allowed a site plan amendment to modify overall building footprints in the single and duplex units of a previously approved elderly housing development and to add vegetation as a buffer and for landscaping, Tax Map 3 Lot 155, 48 Old Nashua Road, zoned AR-1. The owner and applicant is DFC Development, LLC.

In other business members conditionally supported a 2-lot subdivision plan for 26-acre Moose Hill Orchard, Tax Map 9 Lot 49, 114 Pillsbury Road and Mam-

moth Road, zoned AR-1. The town of Londonderry is the applicant.

Lot 49 will be placed under a conservation restriction prohibiting any kind of commercial, residential, or industrial development. The proposed Lot 49-1 of over 5 acres is not currently to be for development and is intended to be sold to the town for municipal purposes. Before any future development can occur, proposed utility systems would be designed under the applicable regulations.

The board also granted an additional 90-day extension to July 8 from the original compliance deadline of Apr. 9 on a site plan for 33 Londonderry Road that it had conditionally approved for parking lot improvements on a multi-tenant building.

that we will continue to offer. The children of families who are learning remotely by their choice will not be affected by this order. You still have the ability to choose to remain remote and we will not make any changes," he said.

He said that the only major difference is that families will have to decide whether or not they want to send their student(s) to school in person for the remainder of the year or if they want them to do remote. The only reason why

people would be able to switch between the two is because of a COVID-19 related issue, like testing positive or being a close contact.

Following the meeting, Laliberte said in an email "while we believe the timing of this Executive Order is ill-advised, Londonderry High School will be prepared to welcome students back to 5 day in-person instruction on Monday April 19 in as safe a manner as is possible under the circumstances."

During the meeting it was pointed out by members of the board and by Laliberte that their original plan was to

return to school in person full-time on May 3, which would allow teachers and staff to be fully vaccinated.

He noted that teachers and staff who want it will be receiving their second dose of the COVID-19 vaccine on April 17.

He said they planned to have it on a Saturday so that way if there are any complications from getting the second dose of the vaccine they would have the weekend to recover.

With that said if a large number of teachers and staff have com-

plications and need to call out they may go with a cancellation day on Monday, April 19. He said that they have one more cancellation day built into the school calendar.

Laliberte called the transition "remarkable."

"The time and effort put forth by teachers, support staff, building & grounds staff and administrators to bring about

this transition has been remarkable, as it has been throughout this pandemic," he said. "Most of all, I would like to thank our students and their families for their continued flexibility and understanding in these unprecedented circumstances."

The next scheduled Londonderry School Board meeting is slated for Tuesday, April 20.

# Planning Board Recommends Partial Commercial Zoning Change

The Londonderry Planning Board has recommended to the Town Council the rezoning of two parcels of land while maintaining current zoning on two other parcels.

The request before the board at its April 7 meeting was to rezone land from Agricultural-Residential 1 and the Route 102 Performance Overlay District to Commercial II consistent with other nearby use and commercial development of the area.

The proposed changes involved 275 Nashua Road, with owner Mark Desrosiers as the applicant. The other properties were 271, 269 and 267 Nashua Road, with the owners and applicants being Wesley and William Tate.

The Tates have a small antique car and service and repair shop on their property and wanted to continue operating the business in a C II zone, also due to the direct frontage on 102. This is a mixed residential use with an in-home business to repair and refurbish antique cars and do other minor repairs not permitted in a C I zone.

The issue involved balancing a commercial corridor with residential development, zoning requirements, enforcement, and what uses to allow or prohibit.

Despite residential

structures on 2 of the lots, the surrounding area has changed over time said Pat Panciocco, an attorney representing Desrosiers and the Tates. In addition, across the street is vacant land primarily zoned C II and wetlands that would be hard to develop, she told the board.

The zoning ordinance at present allows AR-1 use for agriculture, forestry, water quality, preservation, residential, and public type buildings. Public facilities are often not suitable in this location, Panciocco said. These joint lots are 30-40 feet higher than the elevation of the surrounding parcels.

There is an adjacent zoning mix of C I and C II in the parcels across the street, said Town Planner Colleen Mailloux. It was the board's determination to make whether the C II uses were reasonable for that commercial corridor. Other nearby commercially zoned properties are still in the commercial overlay district.

Member Ann Champa said she made an inspection of all properties on the street as far as Parmenter Road and saw no C II properties on either side of the road east of the power lines. The area is basically residential along Parmenter and the abutting strip of land to the west is AR-1, she reported.

In his view, the traffic

from the residential development onto Route 102 would pose more difficulty than that coming from a commercial establishment, said member Giovanni Verani.

In response to a question from Town Council ex-officio Deb Paul on the 102 performance overlay district's impact, Mailloux said the property rezoning request to C II from AR-1 would mean no overlay district any longer unless the applicant wanted to amend the request.

A zoning change goes with a property, not an applicant, allowing any subsequent owners to do what is permitted on the land, noted Chairman Arthur Rugg.

"The only thing that really bothers me is that when we change it, it follows the client and goes to the other person and we don't know what that person in the future would do," Paul stated.

If the applicants were willing just to rezone AR-1 to C II and leave the performance overlay district in place, Panciocco asked if that move would allow the board broader jurisdiction to control property uses.

Mailloux said if the property has underlying zoning of C II in an overlay district, then the allowable uses in the district can only be through a conditional

use permit. The board would have some control in that the site owner must show it met the criteria for a permit.

The non-conforming use comes from having the commercial automotive repair business within the AR-1 and performance overlay district, Mailloux said.

Options the planning board pondered were asking the Board of Zoning Adjustment for an occupational variance on the special exception criteria to the home occupation rule to run a business, and eliminating the performance overlay district but combining C I and C II with conditional use permits.

Member Roger Fillio noted he was leery of conditional use permits given the limits on what can be done on this property.

Others expressed concern over how possible C II business uses would affect the wetlands area.

Marge Badois, chair of the Conversation Commission, said these properties in sitting directly on a hill would drain directly into the

town watershed with an automotive business posing a risk of substances soaking into the ground and possibly getting into subsurface water.

Mike Dolan, an abutting property owner, opposed the change to C II saying it could affect the value of the surrounding residential properties.

Rugg thought the twomost eastern sided lots should remain in AR-1 and the other parcels rezoned to C II while maintaining the performance overlay district for control over what businesses are per-

mitted and under what restrictions.

In a motion member Bruce Hallowell made that the board approved, the parcels at 275 and 271 Nashua Road would be rezoned from AR-1 to C II while maintaining the performance overlay district over the AR-1 properties and keeping the other 2 properties, at 267 and 269 Nashua Road, zoned as AR-1 allowing for limited commercial use.

While the matter now goes before the Town Council, if any applicants object to the board's plan, they don't have to take it to the council.

## School Board - Due Diligence

To the editor,

I want to thank the Londonderry School Board for your recent communications with me concerning possible ramifications of two COVID Relief Grant proposals that the school board will be voting on in the next month or so.

A Public Hearing on the first grant is scheduled for May 4 at 7 p.m., at the High School. The second grant proposal's hearing will be held shortly after that.

I appreciate that you want to assure me and growing numbers of concerned residents who signed our petition to keep CRT training out of Londonderry, including 92 NH State Representatives, that acceptance of this grant will not require, in any form or by any name, the Marxist rooted Critical Race Theory training.

I am confused and concerned about the process the School Board follows to determine a grant's suitability for Londonderry. One representative of the school board told me the school board doesn't have the resources to read/review the grants, because of their complexity and length of documentation.

# Nancy Laporte Wins Distinguished Music Educator Honors

Several months ago, a few parents and students (both past and present), the Principal of North School Paul Dutton, and the Director of Music - Londonderry School District, Serge Beaulieu, wrote letters in support of North School Music Teacher, Nancy Laporte, for the New Hampshire Music Educators (NHMEA) "Distinguished Music Educator of the Year Award". Last week, at the North Elementary School virtual faculty meeting Nancy Laporte was recognized as the recipient of the award. The President of NHMEA, Joseph Mundy, and numerous board members were at the virtual faculty meeting to surprise Nancy with this honor and said:

"Those who are nominated for this award are always accomplished and renowned music educators, most of whom have been in the field developing their craft and reputation for many decades. Receiving this award speaks volumes to the talent and hard work of the recipient because standing out among these nominees is always really tough. The music education community in New Hampshire is small

and close-knit. Everyone knows everyone and we work together collaboratively all year long sharing ideas and resources.

Nancy LaPorte has been a part of the NH music teachers community for the past 37 years. In that time, she has made a profound impact on thousands, of music students and colleagues. I'd like to share a few remarks from one of Nancy's former students:

"In fourth grade, Mrs. LaPorte encouraged me to audition for the first show North School had ever done, and she ended up giving me a role with a solo. That was the first solo I ever sang in front of an audience, and I conquered a fear. The next year, she provided me with an opportunity that changed who I am, and I

ended up writing my college essay about it."

"She has taught me some of the greatest lessons I could learn, even though my time spent with her was at such a young age."

"Mrs. LaPorte will always be a big part of my life, as she has made quite a significant impact on it. She was the individual who sparked

my love for one of the biggest aspects of my life, and I owe her eternally for that. She will be invited to my wedding."

Nancy's students are not the only ones who value her impact on their lives. As one of her colleagues put it, "Nancy has taken her role as a Music Educator and proven that learning goes beyond the four walls of a classroom. Her gift of being able to touch the lives of every student she encounters has been such an inspiration to me. Her positive and humble personality offers a sense of warmth and friendship to all."

Nancy is an exemplary model of what a music educator should be and she should be so proud of the impact she has made on so many. I think one of her former music parents says it best, "So why does Nancy stand out? Children learn to love music early, from their parents and from their 'first' teachers. Nancy's love of music has been passed on over the years to thousands of kids in Londonderry. I truly believe that our music programs at the

middle, and high school level are so successful in our town because of "first teachers" like Nancy LaPorte. She has that extra special something that not all teachers have. She doesn't just do the usual or what's expected, she has always gone above and beyond. It is clear to everyone who meets her that she loves what she does.

with a busy commuting road beside my land. My wife and I moved here almost 40 years ago. Every spring and fall I get my wheelbarrow and pick up the assorted trash that has been discarded along the edge of the road. After the first 20 years or so I realized that you could learn a lot about our local society from that trash.

When we first moved in most of the trash was beer containers and the occasional liquor bottle with cigarette cartons and the occasional condom. One time I even picked up a bra and pair of women's panties at the stop sign! After 20 years the type of trash had changed. Far fewer beer bottles but a big increase in water bottles, 'energy' drinks, juice boxes and McDonalds/Burger King cartons. Still some cigarette cartons

but the condoms had mostly stopped. I guess the stop sign must have got busier at night. I did get a soiled diaper and several McDonald's bags covered in vomit dropped by my mailbox one time so maybe one of the condoms had failed. Now the mix has changed again. No beer bottles or cans at all and very few cigarette cartons. Even the water bottles and juice boxes are greatly reduced. This year's collection was almost entirely Dunkin Donuts iced drink containers and drinking straws. Just a few other items like grocery bags or bits of automobile.

While interesting to see how our 'consumables' have changed, that wasn't my real reason for writing this. My technique for cleanup is to first clear all the 'easy stuff' from the side of the road and put it into the wheelbarrow. Then I advance the wheelbarrow

into the cleaned area so I can go into the bushes and retrieve the stuff that was thrown back into the brush. Sometimes one of the passing cars gives me a friendly wave. I had just parked my barrow and was working back in the bushes. It takes me a while as I'm not as agile

as I used to be. While I was picking up three drink containers and some straws, two or three cars came down the road and continued on their way. When I came back out to the barrow to add these items I noticed that one of those cars had kindly thrown a banana peel on the side of the road,

where I had just cleaned up. Usually they wait until I have gone back into the house before they throw out more trash. At least this highly considerate person had thrown their trash out so that I could pick it up without having to make a second trip.

have it.

"Because of the restrictions that were put into place at the town level and the state level we were not able to do this last year," Muller said.

Muller explained that the roadside cleanup will be taking place for three Saturdays in a row on April 24, May 1 and May 8 at Matthew

Thornton Elementary School from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m.

She said that people of all ages are encouraged to participate in the cleanups. Beautify Londonderry will provide groups with bags, gloves and bright colored participant t-shirts.

Muller said from there they will either be assigned a road to cleanup or if they want

they can decide what road they want to clean.

She said that they are also working with organizations that want to help out but on a different day. She said that one local group the Londonderry High School Community Service Club helped last Saturday with the cleaning of Sargeant Road, the playground and skate park area.

Muller explained that aside from being able to

get trash off the roads in town, the annual cleanup also serves as a way for people to come together and be involved with the community.

"We're trying to get people some community involvement, and volunteerism," Muller said.

Muller said that the group has been planning for the event since November and about two months ago they spoke to Londonderry

Fire Chief Darren O'Brien about being able to have it based on the current COVID-19 restrictions.

She explained that he was fine with them having the event as long as they ensured that everyone who participates follows the precautions that are in place at the time, they stay socially and wear a mask.

"It's a go this year," she said.

Muller said that they

are excited that they are able to have the event again this year.

"We were thankful that we are able to have this event with his approval," she said.

DES then tested both public water system wells and private wells in the plant's vicinity, Wimsatt said. The tests found an airborne transport pathway. Expanded testing discovered drinking water wells in Londonderry were affected.

In addition, DES searched for where people were on private wells and public water supplies. A resulting 2018 consent decree established requirements for Saint-Gobain to provide alternate drinking water and large-scale waterline projects in the impacted locations.

Jeffrey Marts, senior hydrogeologist with the DES hazardous waste remediation bureau, told the task force some sources of PFAS in Lon-

donderry include wet and dry particles that affect numerous wells and the Manchester Airport, the Auburn Road landfill, Apple Tree Mall, and the Tinkham's Garage superfund site.

The town of Londonderry conducts groundwater sampling periodically and includes PFAS in the town wide sampling. Private residents also submit their results to DES. There is public water supply sampling too.

The public water systems in Londonderry consist of standalone community water systems and transient water systems serving many different people

and non-transient systems that regularly serve the same population, noted Brandon Kernen, DES drinking and groundwater bureau chief.

Londonderry has 34 standalone water systems. Arsenic, although occurring naturally, is very toxic and even at this level doesn't have as protective drinking water standards governing it as other substances, Kernen said.

The state lowered its arsenic standard from 10 PPB to 5 PPB and that could potentially affect systems in Londonderry, he added.

For concentrations of PFOA, just under 1200

wells have been sampled across Londonderry, Marts said. The sampling areas are where prior detections have occurred in groundwater.

Data find some houses that exceed ambient groundwater quality standards and require remedial action. These houses can be immediately adjacent to properties that don't exceed the standards.

With the house-to-house variability levels, surficial and bedrock geology plays a role along with chemical changes and seasonal variability, Marts point-

ed out. A drought can raise concerns about arsenic levels but PFOA concentrations tend to decrease with lower water in bedrock wells.

DES offers financial assistance for PFAS treatment given that water system improvements can be costly to rate payers and long-term options may be needed for systems.

A remediation loan fund appropriates \$50 million in state funds for PFAS contamination. This is a low interest loan program for community and non-profit, non-transient public water systems with con-

tingent reimbursement, said Amy Rousseau, PFAS response administrator for DES.

There is also an \$800,000 appropriation fund from the drinking water and groundwater trust fund for which schools and child care centers are eligible along with transient and non-transient public water systems. Reimbursement of design services for treatment installation up to 26% is available.

DES will conduct a public hearing on PFAS May 20 for citizens in Londonderry.
